How It All Began

From the very beginning, the San Francisco Region of the Sports Car Club of America has been a racing region. It's held Concours and rallies. social events and tours, but always in the foreground are the races. The first sports car event of any type I ever went to was the 1949 race held at Buchanan Field in Concord across the Bay, And all the original founders were themselves racers. Names like Harry Fair. Bill David. George Rosenblat, Bill Breeze and Al Coppel were not only on the minutes of the first meetings but were on the grid list of those early races. The first Regional Executive, Bill Breeze had one of the first sports car "Hop Up" shops where the then very small clan of sports car owners found a home for their cars and kindred spirits to bench race with.

The Buchanan Field race gave us Northern California Sports Car buffs our first look at the driving style of a driver who was later to gain world wide acclaim as the first American to win the World Driving Championship. Phil Hill came up from Santa Monica to drive an MGTC powered by a pumped up Ford V8 "Sixty" engine. This Stone Age Cobra had the dubious distinction of making the most number of pitstops for water in the memory of man. Or at least it seemed that way to

Another driver to gain fame in another line of automobile-ism appeared in that race. Bill Devin, who's fiberglass bodies sired a veritable boom of special bodied, stock chassis sports cars in the late fifties and early sixties.

The San Francisco Region used to race on some really tremendous race tracks, too. One of the earliest tracks was right on the famous 17 mile drive area of Del Monte Lodge in Pebble Beach. This turned out to be one of the most spectacular road racing tracks in the country. Hill had one of his earliest and most famous wins on the tree studded, up and down, reversed camber roads. Then, in the last race held there, all the hot-shoes were beaten by a bib-overalled Texan. New to us all, Carroll Shelby had just started his career.

For a couple of years we were able to race in Golden Gate Park, here in the middle of San Francisco, and that was really picturesque. No European Grand Prix circuit had a more scenic setting.

Racing in Golden Gate Park produced some really comical sidenotes, being that close to a residential district. A lot of the old timers in the district who had gone bird watching in the park every Sunday since John McClaren built it after the fire of 1906, found it difficult to understand why the police who attended in great numbers didn't stop all those speeders. In fact, the police

wouldn't even let them cross the streets!

The attitudes and temperments of the drivers and crews were a great deal different from today's professional approach. One driver, a non-English speaking Italian who drove an incredibly beat up Ferrari or Maserati (I forget which), missed the third turn entirely, went across Lincoln Way and was finally flagged down by police while going full bore down 19th Avenue. That was the first and last time we ever saw him on a track.

Ken Miles, a Los Angele. MG mechanic had just begun to gain fame in California and at Golden Gate he drove a stock bodied Mg, the predecessor of his famous MG Specials.

The local rally scene evolved early into the niche it now has. The rallies large and small are run by the smaller local sports car clubs, with one or possibly two big ones being held by the SCCA each year. Some of the early ones were over-nighters and taken as more of a lark than the serious, rolling computerized, highly specialized events that SCCA National rallies are. The local racers entered and drove like it was a race. in one, the first car out had the distinction of arriving at the distant check point ahead of the check point personnel.

One type of event that the San Francisco Region holds now that hasn't changed is it's social parties. Then, as now, they could really swing and were never known to be the tea and crumpets type of thing.

But its hard to describe the history of the San Francisco Region without getting back to the races. Everybody was race conscious and future National SCCA officials got their starts on SCCA tracks, Ray Altman. one time Chairman of the Board of Governors, did a lot of racing locally in Corvettes and Formula Juniors. He was Pacific Coast Formula Junior Champion one year but I best remembered him for his first events in his Corvette when he made really fast laps through the pit areas and then blew up in the first lap.

San Francisco Region racing started hitting the big time when the Laguna Seca track was opened up and names like Lance Reventlow, Chuck Daigh and John Von Neumann were big and the Scarabs, with their big engines were harrassed by the much smaller but equally fast three liter Ferraris. The fall races there had great lineups; Jack Brabham drove Lotus', Surtees drove Coopers, etc., and then Stirling Moss showed us all how it was done. In 1961, he

and Dan Gurney drove identical Lotus 19's. Both had 2.5 liter Climax engines and they turned nearly equal times. What Moss had then that Gurnev did not was showmanship! In the first heat of the two part race, he trailed Gurney quite a while then passed him in the cockscrew, easily the most dangerous part of the track. And what a pass! He was inside on turn six, outside on six "A", waved to the crowd and pulled ahead into turn seven. We'd never seen such a display of driving. Then during the break between the heats, he made a point of coming to all the turns and complimenting all the personnel on doing fine work in flagging. He immediately developed the largest unorganized fan club any race driver ever had.

The rest of the story is fairly recent history. The spring race at Laguna had become part of the United States Road Racing Championship series and the Fall race is in the Canadian-American series. A new circuit is being planned near Modesto and its opening race is to be one of the 1967 Trans-American Sedan race. The outlook is one of increased professionalism, but behind it all is the ever present amateur background of the San Francisco Region, where racing is still fun.
